Itinerary

Day 1: Beijing, China

Upon arrival at Beijing airport, you'll be greeted and transferred to the five-star Four Seasons Hotel for a two-night stay.

Day 2: Beijing, China

Walk along the restored Badaling section of the Great Wall of China. Marvel at the stunning views of the surrounding countryside. Return to Beijing for a leisurely afternoon.

Day 5: On board

Day at leisure on board the train as it travels to Dunhuang.

Enjoy the picturesque views from the Observation Car, or unwind in the Bar Lounge Car with a fine selection of wines and cocktails.

Dinner is served in one of the two dining cars. Overnight on board.

Day 6: Dunhuang, China

Following breakfast, disembark to explore The Mogao Caves, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, often referred to as the "Cave of a Thousand Buddhas." Enjoy music by local folk artists as you explore the caves.

After lunch, trek along the Silk Road by camelback before concluding at Crescent Lake, a stunning natural oasis.

Rejoin the train for drinks, dinner, and overnight on board.

Day 7: Golmud, China

This morning, delve into the rich history of the Silk Road with a special lecture at the Hilton Qinghai-Golmud, followed by a lunch in hotel.

In the afternoon, you may choose to visit the Chaerhan Salt Lake or join a guided city tour.

Day 8: Hotan, China

Enjoy a relaxing morning on board as the train arrives in Hotan, your next destination.

Day 9: Kashgar, China

In Kashgar, visit the Apark Khoja Tomb and the charming old town to see unique Gaotai folk houses and cultural tapestry of the region.

Return to the train after lunch where your journey continues to Turpan with an overnight on board.

Day 10: Turpan, China

Arrive in Turpan and explore the Ancient City of Gaochang, an ancient Silk Road outpost that once served as a vital trading hub.

Day 2: Turpan, China

A delightful lunch in a local restaurant introduces you to the diverse flavours of Uyghur cuisine before returning to the train to continue your westward journey.

Day 5: Hotan, China

Step back in time with a tour of Yotkan Ancient City. Once the heart of the Buddhist Kingdom of Khotan, this ancient city flourished along the Silk Road, its temples and cultural centres revealing Hotan's rich legacy as a nexus of trade and spirituality.

Enjoy also an exclusive visit to Hotan's Atlas Silk and Carpet Workshop. Here, witness master artisans create intricate silk fabrics and carpets using time-honoured techniques passed down through generations.

Day 6: Golmud, China

Your day in Golmud includes an enlightening lecture at the Hilton Qinghai-Golmud on the Silk Road's history, highlighting its role as a bridge between East and West.

Guests may choose to explore the Chaerhan Salt Lake, a surreal landscape of salt flats and mineral deposits, or enjoy a guided tour through Golmud's vibrant city streets, before re-boarding the train.

Day 7: Dunhuang, China

Arriving in Dunhuang, explore the Mogao Caves, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famed for its ancient Buddhist art. This "Cave of a Thousand Buddhas" is a spiritual oasis that has inspired pilgrims and artists for centuries, adorned with vibrant murals and statues that date back over a thousand years. Local folk artists serenade us with music, adding an atmospheric touch to your journey through this sacred complex.

After a delightful lunch, embark on a camel trek along the Silk Road to the enchanting Crescent Lake, an oasis nestled among towering dunes. This tranquil crescent-shaped lake has endured millennia of desert winds and remains a cherished symbol of resilience and beauty.

Day 8: On board

Today is a day of leisure as we traverse the Chinese landscape aboard the *Golden Eagle Silk Road Express*. Take in the panoramic scenery from the observation car's floor-to-ceiling windows, the largest of any train in China, or unwind in the bar car with a selection of fine wines and spirits.

In the evening, arrive into Xi'an and enjoy an authentic Tang Dynasty dinner, where the ambiance is enhanced by a captivating performance of traditional music and dance, evoking the grandeur of ancient Xi'an.
